CALL FOR SERVICE DELIVERY PARTNERSHIP PROPOSALS:

Construction of the Early Childhood Development (ECD) Classroom at Malerato Primary School located in Mohlakeng, Randfontein, Rand West City Local Municipality, Gauteng.

1. Background

Rand Water Foundation is a vehicle through which Rand Water fulfills its commitment to helping Government in achieving its vision of a better life for all, through Water Sanitation and Hygiene (WASH), Jobs Creation Optimisation, Social Enterprise and Rand Water Cares developmental investments. The Foundation is mandated to: Promote delivery of water related services to communities in the areas falling within and outside Rand Water's area of supply; and Coordinate, administer and manage Rand Water's Corporate Social Investment resources by undertaking community development projects in partnership with various donors and relevant stakeholders.

Rand Water Cares is one of the secondary activities implementing RWF Water Sanitation Hygiene (WASH) Plus Impact Driven Strategy. Implemented in partnership with the Gauteng Department of Education (GDE), Early Childhood Development (ECD) support is one of the investments promoting Rand Water as a caring corporate citizen. Capable and experienced Small Micro and Medium Enterprises (SMMEs) in the construction sector are therefore invited to submit proposals for the construction of an ECD classroom at Malerato Primary School as follows:

2. Scope of Work

Proposals should be based on the scope of work as provided below, and in alignment with the prescribed regulatory and legislative frameworks, including provided ECD specifications from the Gauteng Department of Education (GDE). A successful SMME will be expected to undertake the following activities:

2.1. Professional Work

- Design and professional work (e.g. Architectural and Engineering).

2.2. Building Construction

- Comply with the provision of National Environmental Health Norms and Standards for Premises and Acceptable Monitoring Standards for Environmental Health Practitioners, notice 1229 of 2015 in order to obtain a Health Certificate.
- Adhere to all municipal requirements in terms of getting approvals after completion of different phases of the building.
- Provision of the municipal occupational certificate after completion of the construction of the ECD building.
- Provide sufficient 80 square meters (80m²) ECD Classroom, illuminated and ventilated and must be built in accordance with the National Building Regulations and the Building Standards Act, 1977 (Act No. 103 of 1977).
- Provide the kitchen that is safe to prepare food as guided by Guidelines relating to planning for public school infrastructure as signed 25th January 2012.
- Provide the classroom and kitchen with the ceiling that is painted in light coloured paint.
- Paint classroom and kitchen walls with light coloured paint.
- Provide storage facilities for the storage of toys, books and food. The storeroom (± 10m²) must be provided with enough shelves.
- Provide isolation room or sickbay with a bed with clean linen. The sickbay must be provided with sufficient ventilation and hand wash basin with liquid antibacterial soap, disposable paper towel and refuse bin, lockable storage for medical supplies and Medical Aid Kit.
- Provide enough and safe toilet facilities for children, and Teachers. Toilets must be provided with sufficient ventilation, be separated by gender and comply with the ratio of one (01) toilet for twenty (20) children.
- Provide refuse bins with lids and plastic liner in the toilets, classrooms and kitchen.
- Provide hand wash basin in the toilet with hot and cold running water. The hand wash basins must comply with the ratio of one (01) basin for twenty (20) children.
- Provide built-in pigeonholes for storage.
- Provide a veranda and paving around the classrooms.
- Provide outdoor play area of minimum 2m square (2m²) per child, be adequately fenced (2m high) with safe and approved playing material as per Regulations Relating to

National Norms and Standards for Public School Infrastructure as Amended by Minister of Basic Education on the 14th May 2024.

3. Application Requirements:

The following documentation should be attached to the proposals:

- Completed application Form.
- Detailed proposal including project plan and budget
- Company registration documents
- Company to be registered and in operation for two years or more.
- Tax Clearance Certificate.
- BBBEE certificate/affidavit.
- Company Profile.
- Financial report.
- Reference letter regarding the similar work implemented in line with your proposal.
- Attendance of a compulsory site briefing by the applying service delivery partners.
- CIDB level 2 requirement.
